All these changes won't go on for ever, but we don't know how long it will take. Billy and Sally find big changes like this really difficult and a bit confusing. They have lots of questions about the changes so they ask their foster carers. They have some worries too and it helps to tell their foster carer about these. There is a lot of news on the radio and tv about the virus. It can be a bit scary to watch and some of the things are not always true, so it's important to ask your foster carers any questions you have.



The good news is that things will go back to normal for everyone. Nobody knows when this will happen though! In other countries like China, the virus has stopped spreading so much because everyone stopped mixing with too many people like we are doing now. For now though, it's time for everyone to think of lots of fun things they can do while they are off school!!



Billy and Sally are going to keep washing their hands lots and try to help everybody to stop this virus. Once everybody does their bit, we can hopefully all get back to normal soon. This will mean that people will be able to go and visit the people in their families that they don't live with.
