3	<p><b>French - Getting to Know You</b> Learning how to greet each other, count to 10 and say how old they are.</p> <p><b>French – All About Me</b> Understanding and following simple instructions, naming parts of the body, identify colours and talk about what they are wearing.</p>	<p><b>French – Food Glorious Food</b> Learning vocabulary for a range of foods and learning how to express likes and dislikes. Also introduces using plural nouns.</p> <p><b>French –Family and Friends</b> Learning how to introduce family and friends as well as their pets. They will also learn how to spell their names and name areas in a house.</p>	<p><b>French – Our School</b> Learning vocabulary associated with areas in a school and classroom equipment. There is a PE themed lesson given mostly in French and will learn how to express their likes and dislikes at school. Cross curricular links with PE.</p> <p><b>French – Time</b> Learning the days of the week, months of the year and how to say dates in French. They will also learn to count from 11-31. Cross curricular links with maths.</p>
4	<p><b>French – All Around Town</b> Learning about the sights seen in typical French cities. They will also learn to describe places in a town, count to 100 and give their address.</p> <p><b>French – On the Move</b> Allows the children to develop their conversation skills by exploring new topics like transport, direction and movement. Learning the verb 'aller' which means 'to go' and using its forms correctly. Cross curricular links with maths.</p>	<p><b>French – Going Shopping</b> Learning the specific vocabulary of fruit, vegetables and clothing. Learning how to ask key questions when going shopping. Lesson involving role play and opportunity to speak the language they have learnt.</p> <p><b>French – Where in the World?</b> Learning vocabulary for countries, continents and animals. Learning about describing a country's position in relation to the equator and where certain animals are from. Cross curricular links with Geography.</p>	<p><b>French – What's the Time?</b> Learning how to tell the time to the nearest 15 minutes in French. They will also have the chance to read timetables and answer questions based on these. Cross curricular links with maths.</p> <p><b>French – Holidays and Hobbies</b> Learning vocabulary related to holidays, weather and seasons as well as sports and hobbies. Learning how to say what the weather is like.</p>
5	<p><b>French – Pleased to Meet You</b> A chance to recap on their prior knowledge from year 3 &amp; 4. They will then move on to learning how to express their emotions and to talk about the future.</p> <p><b>French – All About Ourselves</b> Recapping on vocabulary associated with the body and clothing and adding new words to their repertoire. They will learn to describe their own appearance and start to become aware of some key French grammatical features such as position and agreement of adjectives.</p>	<p><b>French – That's Tasty</b> Children will recap and learn new vocabulary to do with food and drink. They will learn how to express what they like for specific meals as well as specific things such as favourite fillings for sandwiches or toppings for pizza.</p> <p><b>French – Family and Friends</b> Apply previous skills and knowledge of topic areas such as animals, homes and family to extend their conversation abilities. They will extend their descriptive vocabulary and learn more about how adjectives must 'agree' with the noun they are paired with in relation to number and gender.</p>	<p><b>French – School Life</b> Children will learn key vocabulary to do with subjects, objects and prepositional language. There is a maths lesson which teaches children the name of 2D shapes in French. They will also learn some questions that they may use at school. Cross curricular links with maths.</p> <p><b>French – Time Travelling</b> Children will build on and extend their knowledge of numbers and dates and use this to talk about key events in French history. They will be introduced to common past tenses in French as well as being introduced to the grammatical terms such as conjugation, auxiliary and infinitive verbs.</p>

**French – Let's Visit a French Town**

Children will use and apply their previous knowledge of places in towns, directions and numbers. They will have more practise using bilingual dictionaries and become more familiar with word classes and other grammatical features of the language.

**French - Let's Go Shopping**

Builds on learning about the French shopping experience. They will learn how to describe clothing colours as well as using prepositional language. They will learn some key phrases for asking the questions needed when going shopping.

**French – This is France**

Children will learn specific vocabulary related to France and in particular, Paris. Using positional language to describe which countries border France and about famous French landmarks. Cross curricular links with Geography.

**French - All in a day**

Learning how to tell the time to the nearest 5 minute. They will also learn to use 24 hour times as well as the way in which a.m. and p.m. are represented in France. They will use airport departure boards and a school timetable to consolidate their skills. Cross curricular links with maths.

**French - Our Precious Planet**

Learn to talk about and describe environmental challenges in the local area. They will learn how to use the immediate future tense to describe what positive actions they are going to take. The end of the unit gives the opportunity for the children to prepare and perform a short presentation of what they know.

**French – More to Explore**

Children will develop their vocabulary skills and practise a range of key French sounds. They will read a lovely French story and learn a rap to learn key rhyming sounds. They will be able to take part in conversations, interviews, games, activities and surveys as well as reading and writing challenges. There is even a space alien escape room activity to help with their French grammar skills.
